## Considerations regarding Covid -19 precautions from 4<sup>th</sup> July 2020 until further notice (updated 3<sup>rd</sup> August)

With the Government allowing the reopening of Churches for public worship from July 4<sup>th</sup> it is important that we put in place measures to reduce the risk of transmitting/catching Covid-19, so the following is a list of the actions we feel are necessary to implement in order that we may join together in the Chapel for services of worship.

Shielding No one in the high risk group should attend

Symptom's A notice asking people displaying classic covid-19 symptoms to stay away

Social distancing There will be notices reminding people to keep 2m apart.

Pews will be taped off to facilitate 2m distancing. It will mean some of us having

to use different seats.

Pews will be designated for visitors

Reducing Cross contamination

Use the same bibles/hymnbooks (see note below) for each service. Those choosing hymns to restrict their choice to one book, Psalms and Hymns. Visitors to collect their bibles in the foyer and leave them in the seats at the end

of the service. These will not be reused for 7 days.

Gents to use the outside loo/ females the one in the Sunday School. Paper

towels to be used for drying hands.

Hand sanitizer provided in the foyer

Door handles to be sanitized before/after services.

Online provision For those unable to attend, the services will be relayed via Webex, the Minister

will speak from the table at the front as on previous occasions.

A decision on how prayer meetings will be conducted will made after we see

how the first Sunday works out.

Hymn Singing At the moment this seems to be specifically banned so we will comply with the

restrictions. It might be possible to play hymns on the computer and the

congregation listen to them.

Lord's Supper Each communicant to bring their own bread and glass.

Hospitality Hospitality will be dealt with on a week by week basis in discussion with the

minister.

Masks Face coverings are required from 8<sup>th</sup> August. Please bring your own if possible,

but there will also be a limited supply in the foyer.
